We take every opportunity to celebrate. Big events and things like birthdays are always special and celebrated, but our favorite types of celebrations are things like an ice cream outting on a random night after we've all supported each other through a busy or draining week, or when we've shifted out of a loop of something that wasn't serving us at home, or for things that the girls are especially proud of themselves for, like Eleanor's first time having a spelling test that she studied hard for, or after Genevieve climbed a tree on her own with

confidence! The kids love to decorate for holidays and make art to have around the house - we have a special art wall in the kitchen that the girls show off whenever we have guests.




THE WHOLE FAMILY

We're also lucky to live within 20 minutes of Isaac's parents, Karen and David. Karen will be retiring in Spring of 2024 and we can't wait to spend more time together with flexible schedules. Genevieve and Iris + Eleanor and Leo have very special cousin relationships that we wouldn't trade for the world. Autumn's brother and his fiance, Fima, are a 6 hour drive away in a large urban city, and her dad, Ryan, and his wife, Sandra, are a 3 hour drive away. WORK, PLAY & EDUCATION

We have both worked hard to reach our career current career goals with each other's support - the most recent goal before moving forward with pursuing adoption being for Autumn to finish her supervised clinical hours to become a Licensed Clinical Social Worker where she could open her own private practice. The purpose of work for us is to find a career fit that supports what want in our lives - for us, it means enough financial stability to not have stress with finances, but more important than that is having flexible daily schedules so we can do things like volunteer at the kids' school or snuggle them on the couch when they're home sick or travel for longer trips, like when we went to Portugal.

To be able to achieve the financial stability and work-life balance we wanted, we moved across the country for Autumn to complete her Master's Degree at the best school in the nation for her degree. When we returned to Oregon and settled down, Isaac went back to school as a non-traditional student, and graduated just as the COVID-19 pandemic started. Within a few years, Isaac progressed in his career to now working for one

of the major tech companies. We both work from home and we are our children's caregivers - we rarely, if ever, have babysitters.

Our days are structured and follow routine but are flexible, with adjusting to the needs of our family system. For instance, Friday night is our movie night as a family, though if the kids are especially tired, we'll change it to Saturday night and feed them dinner in the bath. Another example being bedtime is within the range of 6-7:30 and adjusts based on the needs of the individuals in the family. If one child needs more sleep and one needs more connection, we adjust our routine to make that happen. Our days are predictable, though flexible. The kids always know a basic framework of what to expect and we tell them about the plan for the day each morning. When we asked Eleanor how to answer how predictable our days were for the home study, she said, "I think there's maybe one day a year where I don't know what the plan is."

We support the children in exploring their interests and take on the interest as a family. This is guided by them and supported by us in any way we can do so.

OUR PETS WILLOW, LUNA 8 YELLOW

Willow is our youngest pet; she is our just turned 2-year-old Australian Labradoodle and she is the biggest snuggle bug.
